

**Ballot Measure Validation & Passage Requirements
November 8, 2011 General & Special Election**

State of Washington – Initiative Measure No. 1125 - Concerns state expenditures on transportation.

- There are no validation requirements for this state ballot measure
- A simple statewide majority (50% plus one vote) of YES votes to pass
(State Constitution, Article II, Section 1(d))

State of Washington – Initiative Measure No. 1163 - Concerns long-term care workers and services for elderly and disabled people.

- There are no validation requirements for this state ballot measure
- A simple statewide majority (50% plus one vote) of YES votes to pass
(State Constitution, Article II, Section 1(d))

State of Washington – Initiative Measure No. 1183 - Concerns liquor: beer, wine, and spirits (hard liquor).

- There are no validation requirements for this state ballot measure
- A simple statewide majority (50% plus one vote) of YES votes to pass
(State Constitution, Article II, Section 1(d))

State of Washington – Senate Joint Resolution No. 8205 - The legislature has proposed a constitutional amendment on repealing article VI, section 1A, of the Washington Constitution.

- There are no validation requirements for this state ballot measure
- A simple statewide majority (50% plus one vote) of YES votes to pass
(State Constitution, Article II, Section 1(d))

State of Washington – Senate Joint Resolution No. 8206 - The legislature has proposed a constitutional amendment on the budget stabilization account.

- There are no validation requirements for this state ballot measure
- A simple statewide majority (50% plus one vote) of YES votes to pass
(State Constitution, Article II, Section 1(d))

Clark County Public Transportation Benefit Area Authority (C-TRAN) – Proposition No. 1 – Increase the sales and use tax.

- A simple majority (50% plus one vote) of YES votes to pass
(Revised Code of Washington 82.14.045)

City of Woodland – Proposition No. 1 – Increase the sales and use tax for police station.
