Public Safety Complex Open House



SCHOOL BUS STOP RULES

A new school year is starting and many of our children will be riding the busses to and from school. The Washington State Patrol (WSP) would like you to take a few minutes to refresh your knowledge on how to drive safely around school busses as they are picking up and dropping off our children.

The WSP has posted a video discussing rules of the road and driving safety around the school busses; when you have to stop and when may proceed. The School Bus Stop Rules video is posted at <http://www.youtube.com/watch?v=moK9MZVSIQY&feature=plcp>

The law states the \$394 fine for failure to stop for a school bus cannot be reduced, suspended, or waived. If you get a ticket for failure to stop for a

school bus you will pay the full amount.

We cannot stress enough how important it is to practice safe driving, especially when children are present.

timers, and request your neighbors keep a watch on your property. You can also make your house a less attractive target by keeping hedges and bushes trimmed back, allowing open views to all sides of your home, and setting motion sensor lights.

Auto Prowls/Thefts

Vehicles are prowled or stolen every day in Clark County. Help prevent these thefts by removing valuables from your car and parking in highly visible areas. Electronics like GPS, Ipods, and laptops stand out as quick cash to a crook. Garage door openers are sometimes taken to gain access to your house. Do not leave a running, unlocked vehicle unattended to "warm it up." These are easy targets for thieves on cold mornings. Always be vigilant and report people who appear to be going car to car, looking in windows.

Stranger Danger

Attacks from strangers are rare in Clark County but it is always good to use safe practices when in public. Keep yourself from being an easy target by maintaining good posture, make eye contact with others, and avoid items that limit your awareness such as headphones, cell phones, alcohol and drugs. It is always safer to travel in a group. Teach kids to avoid conversations with strangers and to yell for help if a stranger grabs them.
