

Impacting lives one hour at a time

A new time bank program has started in Clark County. It has become increasingly important for individuals and families to find alternative ways to meet their needs. There is an abundance of talent, skills and energy in our communities in the form of people. The hOur IMPACT Time Bank provides an organized and safe system for individuals to trade skills and services.

A time bank is a program where individuals exchange assets, resources and expertise with time as the sole currency. For every hour deposited in the hOur IMPACT Time Bank, members are able to withdraw an hour of service. Every individual's time is valued equally, from driving to lawn maintenance. The hOur IMPACT Time Bank will reconnect neighbors and encourage community building while assisting those who may be unable to pay for important needed services. A time bank works for everyone and supports the ability to live independently, promotes good health and positive social well-being.

Members of the hOur IMPACT Team will be presenting to the North Salmon Creek Neighborhood Association at the September meeting. Come by the meeting and learn about this new community program that may be beneficial to you or someone you know!

How Does the Proposed Lid Lift Affect You?

Clark County Fire District 6 will ask voters to approve a levy lid lift to restore funding for emergency services. Call volumes have skyrocketed - 31.25% in 10 years, and 10% in the past year alone - as has the cost to provide emergency services. Firefighter training, medical care, replacing facilities, engines and equipment - these types of costs are out of our control, but represent real needs for our community. The District has cut expenses by \$385,225, postponed vehicle and facility replacements, and have drawn down reserves from \$1.7 million to a low of \$250,000 - all to maintain emergency service levels.

Shawn Newberry started his fire service career as a Volunteer Firefighter with Tualatin Valley Fire and Rescue in 1996. Chief Newberry served as a firefighter until his promotion to Captain in 2009. In 2011, he moved into the Training Division and served as Fire Training Captain for the Fire District. In April of 2013, Chief Newberry was promoted to Assistant Chief and serves by leading the Operations section of the Fire District.
