Children with Special Health Care Needs
Specialized nursing staff support for children with special health care needs.

Nurse Family Partnership
An evidence-based nurse home visiting program that improves pregnancy outcomes, child growth and development, and families' economic self-sufficiency.

Immunization Quality
Distributes, oversees and monitors vaccines for children; improves community immunization status.

Communicable Disease
Disease and outbreak investigation and control; monitoring; prevention education; jail health services contract monitoring.

Tuberculosis
Screens, diagnoses, treats, and prevents TB infection.

HIV/AIDS Prevention
Educates & provides outreach services to high-risk individuals; HIV counseling, testing & syringe exchange.

HIV Case Management
Coordinates and assists with medical care, housing, mental health and substance abuse services.

Healthy Eating & Active Living
Active living; promote policies, environments, and programs to make the healthy choice the easy choice.

Partnerships for Healthy Neighborhoods (P4HN)
Work with Neighborhood residents, organizations and business to improve birth outcomes, ensure children are healthy and ready for school, and reduce child abuse and neglect.

Tobacco
Works with partners on prevention and reduction of tobacco use and to create communities that support smoke-free living.

Drinking Water
Ensures adequate quantity and quality of drinking water.

Solid/Hazardous Waste
Ensures solid and hazardous wastes are properly disposed and complaints investigated.

On-Site Septic Systems
Protects drinking water and prevents illness by overseeing on-site treatment systems.

Food
Provides foodhandler education and certification; food service plan reviews and inspections; works to improve access to healthy, affordable food.

Pools/Beaches (Water Recreation)
Pool and spa inspection results; operation and maintenance guidance to reduce risk of waterborne illness; water quality test results for public swim beaches.

Assessment
Measures community health indicators and reports to community.

Evaluation
Systematically evaluates programs and services.

Health Impact Assessment
Leads HIA team in conducting formal and informal assessments of the impacts of the built environment on health.

Oral Health
Educates and promotes positive oral health; provides technical assistance to health care providers; assessing oral health status of community

Health Systems
Improves health care access and quality; promotes preventive services; informs and prepares for Healthcare Reform.

Pregnancy Support
Helps women obtain early prenatal care and other pregnancy resources; promotes high school completion for teen parents.
