IT'S ALL ABOUT CHOICES...

WHAT IS THE HOME COLLECTION PROGRAM?

The Home Collection Program is a service offered by Clark County and its cities to help eligible seniors and residents with disabilities living in our community to safely dispose of any hazardous waste they may have in their homes.

HOW DO I KNOW IF I HAVE ANY HOUSEHOLD HAZARDOUS WASTE?

Household hazardous waste is any waste left over from products such as **pesticides, paints, solvents, batteries, thinners, motor oil, anti-freeze, and household cleaners**. These products have the potential to harm people, pets, and the environment. Household hazardous wastes should never be thrown in the trash, dumped on the ground, poured down a storm drain, or burned.

WHERE CAN I SAFELY DISPOSE OF HAZARDOUS WASTE?

If you **are eligible** for this program, you can now have your household hazardous waste picked up right from your home.

If you **are not eligible**, but live in Clark County or its cities, you can safely dispose of your household hazardous waste at any of several local household hazardous waste collection facilities or mobile collection events. WHO IS ELIGIBLE?

To see if you qualify for this service, please call Clark County Solid Waste at (360) 397-6118 ext. 4352.

When you call for home collection of your hazardous waste, you will be asked several questions to determine your eligibility for the program. The program has a limited budget and is designed to help those who have no means of disposing of their household hazardous waste themselves.

Questions include:

Are you over the age of 65 or are you a person with disabilities?

Are you able to drive to the local household hazardous waste collection facilities or mobile collection events?

Is there anyone else who can drive you and/or your hazardous waste to the household hazardous waste collection facilities or mobile collection events?

IF YOU MEET THE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS,

you will be asked to provide your name, address, and telephone number. You will also be asked about the types and amounts of waste you have for collection. A collection date will then be scheduled; collections normally occur between 9 a.m. and 3 p.m., Monday through Friday. At the time of collection, you will be asked to sign a certificate verifying your eligibility.
