BACKGROUND

Consistent with strategic initiative #1, Public Health coordinates emergency preparedness activities in Clark County and for Region IV (Public Health Emergency Preparedness).

The grant will fund the travel of one Region IV Medical Reserve Corp (MRC) coordinator and one MRC volunteer to attend the NAACHO Public Health Preparedness Summit, April 14-17, 2015 in Atlanta, GA. The Preparedness Summit is the first and longest running national conference on public health preparedness and convenes a wide array of partners, including MRC, to participate. Information gathered at this summit will be shared with regional MRC members during meetings and trainings to increase the volunteers' ability to help our community to prepare, respond, and recover from emergencies and disasters.

- Clark County Board of Commissioners' approval to apply for \$3,500.00 in grant funding from the National Association of County & City Health Officials.


